And Penrith is also a great base for experiencing the nearby Hawkesbury and World Heritage Blue Mountains regions.

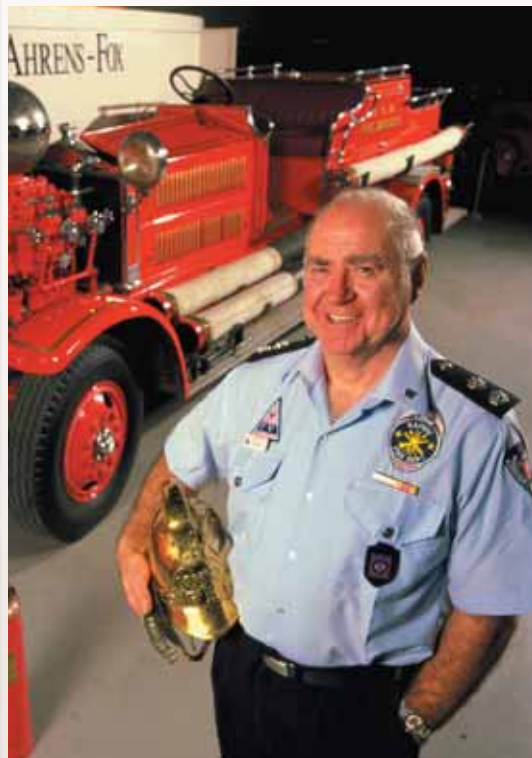

Nepean River

Spectacular natural features

Greater Sydney, Australia's leading city, is known for its many scenic features.

Penrith Valley is part of Greater Sydney and is where two of Sydney's most spectacular scenic features can be found.

One is the World Heritage listed Blue Mountains whose eastern escarpment forms a superb backdrop to Penrith Valley's western fringe.

The other is the Nepean River, part of one of the greatest river systems of eastern Australia.

The Blue Mountains and the Nepean River meet in Nepean Gorge, the geographical heart of Penrith Valley. You can see this at "The Rock" lookout, a short drive south of the Penrith CBD. Try to see this stunning view when you visit Penrith Valley.

You will get some idea of what the view from "The Rock" lookout is like from the picture above. See how the Nepean River has carved its path through the sandstone of the Blue Mountains, to create the Penrith Valley.

For an intimate experience of the inspiring Nepean Gorge launch a canoe, row-boat or power boat at the boat ramp and wharf at Tench Reserve and head up the river into the Gorge, or join a guided fishing or canoe tour.

Alternatively sit back, relax and do it the easy way aboard one of the cruise vessels that regularly traverse the Gorge. During evening dinner cruises, the Gorge can be floodlit from the vessel, adding to the drama of the bush scenery.
